Project Cornerstone Book-of-the-Month #6

This month's ABC book: **"Empty Pot"** by Demi tells the story of Ping, a young Chinese boy with a green thumb who wins the emperor's competition. Ping stands by his values even when it is not easy to do.

Goals of lesson:

- Model how to act with courage, honesty, integrity, responsibility, and perseverance. (CHIRP).
- **Empower students** to act as *UPstanders* and create *circles of trust* with peers.
- Stand by beliefs and stand up for them with courage and determination.
- Use resistance skills to resist peer pressure.

To reinforce this lesson at home:

- > Tell your child about a time when you stood up for something even though it was difficult to do. Explain how you felt.
- > Share a time when you didn't stand up for something because you were afraid. Discuss why it's easier to act on your convictions in some situations than others.
- Notice, name and celebrate when:
 - You or your child say or do something as an UPstander.
 - Your child tells the truth when it is hard to do so.
 - Your child accomplishes something small or large, especially when trying their best.
 - o Family, friends, and neighbors model positive values.
- > Talk Together (Questions to discuss with your child):
 - What happens in the book Empty Pot? (This is a great story!)
 - o What does integrity mean to our family?
 - When is it easy to act on your beliefs? When is it difficult? Why?
 - What happened the last time you stood up for or spoke out about what you value?

When you "catch" kids modeling positive behaviors... Notice, Name it, and Celebrate it!
